- Friday Mark 7
- Saturday Ephesians 2

Primer Exercise:

For Children

Say to your children, "God wants us to do everything we do like we're doing it for him. What do you think that means?"

"One of the things it means is that we should our best at everything we do. Today, I'd like for you to draw a picture and do your very best."

Lay out blank sheets of paper and some <u>dot-to-dot sheets</u>. Make sure to also provide plenty of colored pencils or markers. If your kids don't know what dot-to-dot sheets are, explain that they are a way for them to draw a picture according to someone else's design.

After everyone has finished their work, ask them:

- Why did you choose the type of paper that you did?
- Which type of picture was harder to make?
- Which one would an artist choose?

- What are some other ways that ancient people might have navigated by land or boat?
- What benefits might there be to navigating by the stars?
- How is Polaris like the message about Christ?

Session Two: "Like Sheep"


- Read Isaiah 53:4-9
 - o How would you define "transgression" from this passage?
 - o Do you think it's possible for someone who's never heard of the Bible to transgress?
 - O What differences do you see between the two references to sheep?
- Application and Prayer
 - O What does this passage warn us not to do?
 - O What should we do instead?

Session Three: "God's Grownups"


- Read Galatians 3:19-25
 - O Why did God give the Mosaic law?
 - O What did he send to replace the law?
 - Now that the new standard has come, what should we do with the previous one?
- Application and Prayer
 - o Think through the implications of the following points of the gospel for how we should live:
 - What should we do now that Christ has died for our sins?

 - How should we behave to be ready for his return?
 - o Commit your answers to God in prayer.

Scripture Discussion

- Read Romans 5:12-21
 - O How does Paul support his claim that everyone was made a sinner through Adam's transgression?
 - o What's the difference between sin and transgression in this passage?
 - O Why would God consider a whole race guilty for one man's sin?
 - o If we didn't need the law to make us guilty or to lead us to righteousness, why did God give it?

Pray

- Get a volunteer to close the prayer time at the end.
- > Divide into three groups and read Psalm 32 aloud as follows:

All - Blessed is the one whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered.
Blessed is the one whose sin the LORD does not count against them and in whose spirit is no deceit.

Group 1 - When I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long. For day and night your hand was heavy on me; my strength was sapped as in the heat of summer.

Group 2 - Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity.
I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD."
And you forgave the guilt of my sin.

Group 3 - Therefore let all the faithful pray to you while you may be found; surely the rising of the mighty waters will not reach them.

You are my hiding place; you will protect me from trouble and surround me with songs of deliverance.

Leader – I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my loving eye on you.

Do not be like the horse or the mule,
which have no understanding
but must be controlled by bit and bridle
or they will not come to you.

All - Many are the woes of the wicked, but the LORD's unfailing love surrounds the one who trusts in him. Rejoice in the LORD and be glad, you righteous; sing, all you who are upright in heart!

Segue into an open prayer time.

Collaborate

Each participant should have listened to Message #11 in *The Ologies*, "Transgression" in person or online and taken notes.

- Have everyone share their answers to the **Thought Questions** in their *Message Notes*.
- If anyone has already done the **Obedience Challenge**, have them report on how it went and what they learned.
- Encourage (but don't require) participants to share their **Next Steps** or any **Application** entries from their SOAP journals.
- Close by praying for each other's Next Steps and Application entries.
