Thought Questions:

- 1. How do our beliefs about our origins affect our outlook on life?
- 2. What correlations do you see between the Creation-Fall story in Genesis 2-3 and Job 1-3?
- 3. What challenges does the doctrine of creation present?
- 4. How does the gospel overcome those challenges?

Next Steps:

- 1. List some disappointments you've had with God.
- 2. Ask him to show you what you were supposed to learn from those trials.

Obedience Challenge: Sufferer Support

Job's friends' religious beliefs made them uncompassionate. Let's not be like them. Contact a nursing home, hospital, or hospice care facility and ask how you can bring comfort to the suffering there. Perhaps you could commit to visit someone who's especially lonely or donate snacks for family members visiting dying relatives.

DAILY DEVOTION GUIDE:

Read the following Scriptures about humankind as created beings, throughout this week. Use the <u>SOAP journaling</u> <u>method</u> to help you go deeper into the text. (See Handout)

- Monday Psalm 9
- Tuesday Psalm 10
- ➤ Wednesday Psalm 102
- Thursday Psalm 103
- > Friday Ezekiel 28
- ➤ Saturday 1 Peter 4

During your Life Team meeting, you'll be given the opportunity to share some of your Application entries. Consider bookmarking any that you'll want to share by way of confession or to encourage others.

INTERGENERATIONAL GATHERING GUIDE:

Primer Exercise:

For Children

Set out coloring pages, blank sheets of paper, and crayons for your kids. Say, "Today, I want you to create something brand new from your imagination."

Show them the coloring pages and the blank paper side by side and ask which one they would like to use. Talk about what it means to "create." Let them create their works of art and celebrate their creativity.

Say, "Since you did such a great job of creating, I think it's time you graduated to the next level."

Take away all of the materials and instruct them to begin. If they try to acquire materials or object that the task is impossible, explain to them that paper, crayons, and even their imaginations have already been created. If they want to truly create, they'll need to start with nothing.

- Talk with them about how God created the world:
 - O Why can't we create in the same way that God created the universe?
 - O What must God be like if he could create everything from nothing?

Everyone Else

- Richard Dawkins once said that Darwin allowed people to become "intellectually fulfilled atheists." How does this video either support or refute that claim?
- Give your argument for why you think that Dawkins is either in favor of, or against, the idea of intelligent design.
- What does Richard Dawkins believe?

The three sessions below are designed for home devotional use. Each session should be done in a separate sitting.

Session One: "Back to Dust"

- Read Psalm 90
- Ask:
 - Why is it sometimes hard to think about God as our Almighty creator?
- Read Job 34:1-30
 - o How does Elihu argue for God's justice?
 - O What do you think of his arguments?
- Application and Prayer
 - o Discuss places around the world where people are being oppressed. Pray for God to intervene.

Session Two: "My Tongue will Tell"

- Read Psalm 71
 - o What made the Psalmist confident that God would help him through hard times?
- Read 1 Peter 4:19
 - o Why should knowing God as "a faithful creator" allow us to continue doing good even in times of suffering?
- Application and Prayer
 - o Make a list of the good things that God has done for you and your family.
 - o Spend some time praising him for those.

Session Three: "Destroy the Destroyers"

- Read Psalm 104
- Ask: Why does the psalmist pray that sinners vanish from the earth and the wicked be no more?
- Read Revelation 11:16-19:
 - O What's going to happen when God comes to judge the world?
 - o How is this a fulfilment of the psalmist's prayer?
- Application and Prayer
 - o How do people destroy the earth?
 - o How can you help to slow that destruction or even repair it?

LIFE TEAM GATHERING GUIDE:

Scripture Discussion

- ➤ Read Job 16:15-22 in the NIV²
 - O Why do you think Job supposes that he has a witness in heaven?



Pray

➤ Read the following adaptation of Psalm 71:17-21 in unison:

Since my youth, God, you have taught me, and to this day I declare your marvelous deeds.

Even when I am old and gray, do not forsake me, my God, till I declare your power to the next generation, your mighty acts to all who are to come.

Your righteousness, God, reaches to the heavens, you who have done great things.

Who is like you, God?

Though you make me see troubles, many and bitter, you will restore my life again; from the depths of the earth you will again bring me up.

You will increase my honor and comfort me once more.

Segue into a time of group prayer. The group leader or someone they appoint can close the time when they feel so led.

Collaborate

Each participant should have listened to Message #7 in The Ologies, "Created" in person or online and taken notes.

- Have everyone share their answers to the Thought Questions in their Message Notes.
- If anyone has already done the Obedience Challenge, have them report on how it went and what they learned.
- Encourage (but don't require) participants to share their Next Steps or any Application entries from their SOAP
 journals.
- Close by praying for each other's Next Steps and Application entries.
